## Scottish Bishop Supports Cursillo



Most Rev. Bruce Cameron, the retired Primus and primate of the Episcopal Church of Scotland, and the retired bishop of the diocese of Orkney and Aberdeen. Primus is the title of the primate of Scotland, and is similar to our Presiding Bishop here in the USA. Bishop Cameron and his wife Elaine are guests of Bruton Parish.
